You are interested in training your dog to be a Pet Doctor. You have found an online guide on how to train your pet to be a Pet Doctor. Read the guide.

Introduction to the Pet Doctor Programme

1 What is the Pet Doctor Programme?

Dr Mike Ng started the Pet Doctor Programme in 1999. He noticed that his elderly grandmother often visited him at his animal clinic because she loved to see the pets there. That gave him the idea for the programme. In the Pet Doctor Programme, pets visit homes for the elderly and hospitals to cheer people up.

2 How can my pet join the programme?

Not all pets are suitable for this programme. For example, we do not accept pets like lizards and turtles. Our vets will examine your pet before it can begin training for the programme. Only healthy pets can become pet doctors.

3 Your pet must pass the training course before it can be a pet doctor. This is to make sure your pet is comfortable with being around strangers and will not bite them. Training sessions take place from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. on Wednesdays. The course lasts for two months.

How often will my pet need to be a pet doctor?


