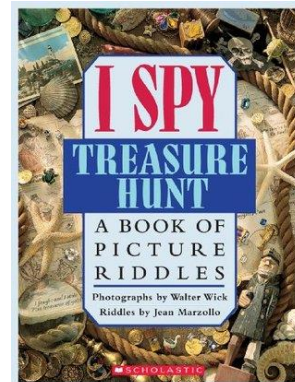


## English Book Recommendation

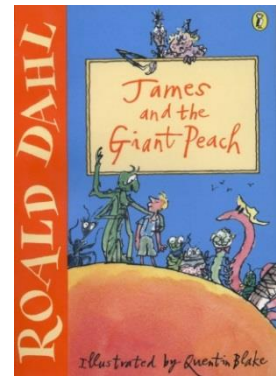
#### Personal sharing by Mr. Malik

### Author

Roald Dahl was born in 1916 in Wales. Before becoming a book writer and author, he had worked in East Africa for an oil company and also as a RAF fighter pilot in Second World War.

His first paid piece of writing was based on his experience as the pilot at World War Two. He then worked with Walt Disney to write his first full-length story called The Gremlins. Charlie and the Chocolate Factory is his best-known book which was first published in 1964. His last book was called The Minpins.

Roald Dahl died in 1990 at the age of 74. The motto that he lived by was “My candle burns at both ends. It will not last the night. But ah my foes and oh my friends. It gives a lovely light.”

### Summary of the book
